WADI SHAB

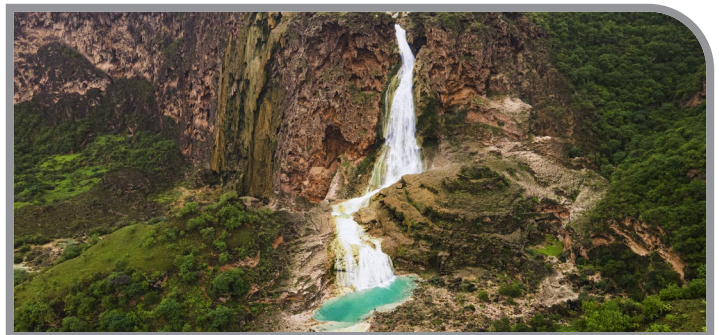


CULTURE & TRADITION
