ICONIC ZIMBABWE LANDMARKS



VICTORIA FALLS

One of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World, Victoria Falls is Zimbabwe's most famous landmark and one of the most breathtaking sights on Earth. Locally known as "The Smoke That Thunders," the falls send mist high into the sky as the Zambezi River crashes into the gorge below. Visitors can enjoy scenic viewpoints, rainforest walks, sunset cruises, and adrenaline adventures such as rafting, bungee jumping, and helicopter flights over the falls.

HWANGE NATIONAL PARK

Hwange is Zimbabwe's largest national park and one of Africa's finest safari destinations. Famous for its massive elephant population, the park is also home to lions, leopards, buffalo, giraffes, zebras, and countless bird species. Game drives across open plains and waterholes offer incredible opportunities for photography and close-up wildlife viewing.

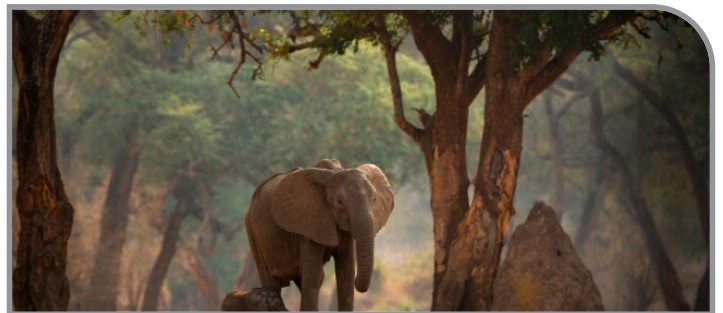


GREAT ZIMBABWE RUINS

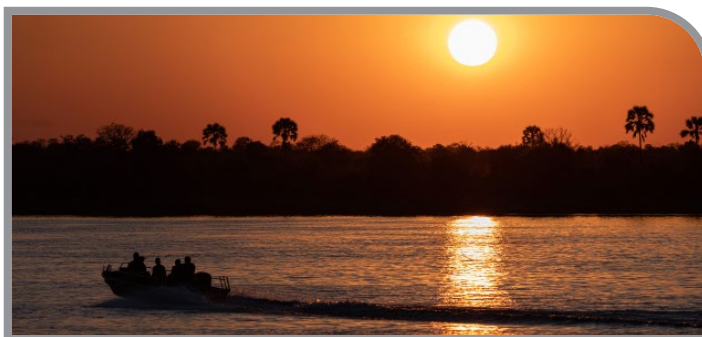

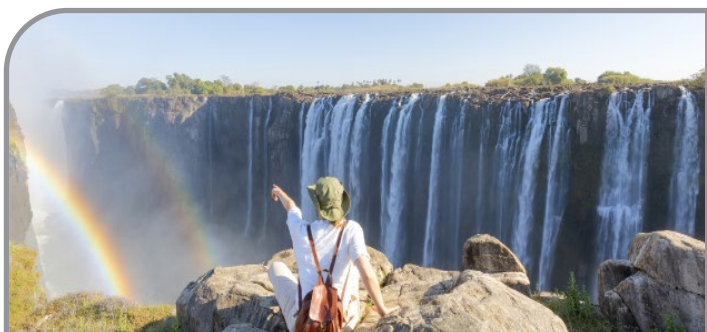
