ICONIC BOLIVIA LANDMARKS



UYUNI SALT FLATS

The Salar de Uyuni is the largest salt flat on Earth, a vast and surreal landscape that feels more like another planet than a place on Earth. Stretching over 4,000 square miles across the high-altitude Altiplano, its brilliant white surface creates a horizon that seems to disappear into the sky. During the dry season, the flats resemble a massive natural mosaic of salt polygons, glowing under intense sunlight. In the rainy season, a thin layer of water transforms the entire expanse into a perfect mirror, reflecting clouds, stars, and sunsets in a way that feels almost dreamlike. Visitors can explore Incahuasi Island, covered in towering cacti, visit colorful mineral lagoons filled with flamingos, and experience the silence and immensity that define this extraordinary place.

LA PAZ

La Paz is a city like no other, dramatically set within a deep canyon and surrounded by the snow-capped peaks of the Andes. As one of the highest capital cities in the world, it offers breathtaking views at every turn, with neighborhoods cascading down steep hillsides. The city pulses with energy, from bustling street markets and artisan stalls to historic plazas and modern districts. One of its most unique features is the Mi Teleférico cable car system, which connects different parts of the city while offering sweeping panoramic views from above. Nearby, the Valley of the Moon reveals a striking landscape of jagged rock formations sculpted by erosion, creating an almost lunar environment. La Paz blends tradition and modern life in a way that feels vibrant, chaotic, and unforgettable.



LAKE TITICACA & ISLA DEL SOL

Lake Titicaca, shimmering high in the Andes, is the highest navigable lake in the world and one of the most sacred places in South America. Its deep blue waters stretch across the border of Bolivia and Peru, framed by distant mountains and wide open skies. On the Bolivian side, Isla del Sol stands as a place of myth and history, believed to be the birthplace of the Inca civilization. The island is dotted with ancient ruins, terraced hillsides, and quiet villages where traditional ways of life continue. Walking along its scenic trails offers sweeping views of the lake and a sense of timelessness that defines the region. Sunrises and sunsets here are especially breathtaking, casting golden light across the water and mountains.

SUCRE
