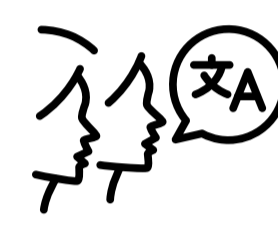

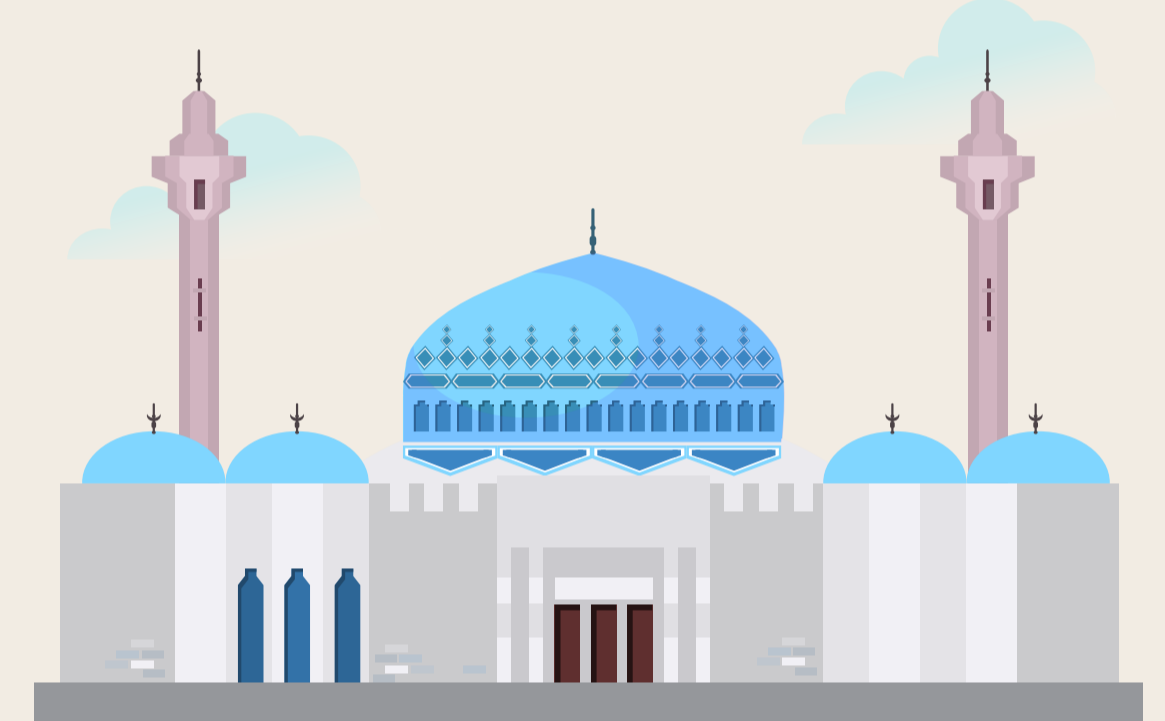
WADI RUM

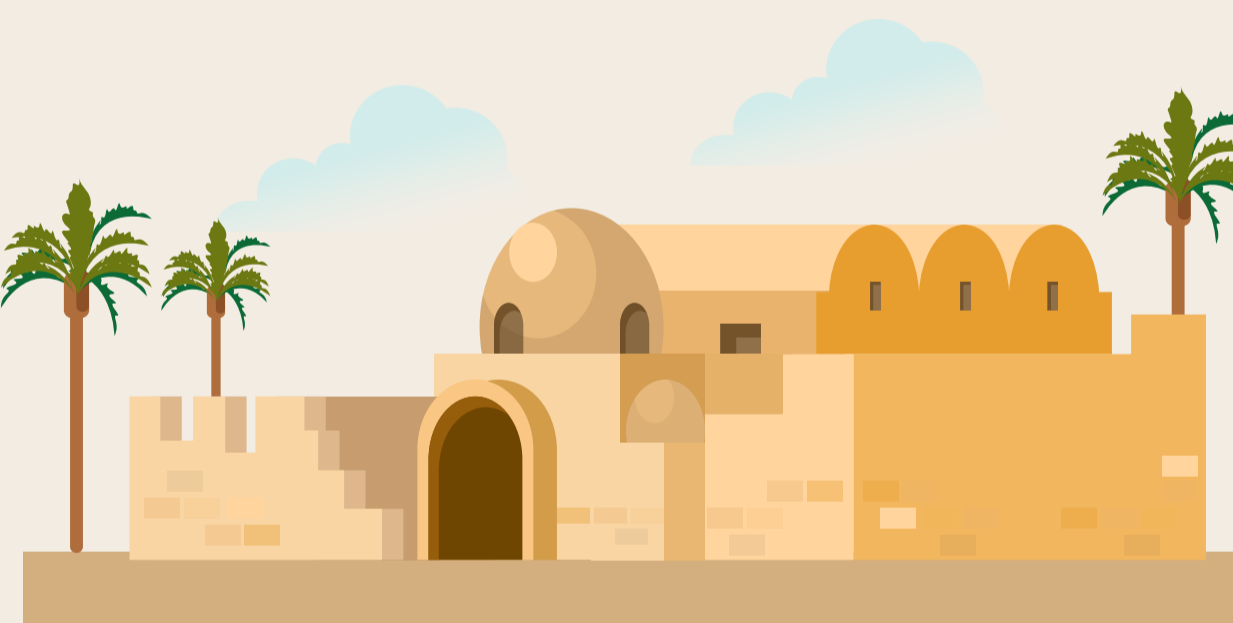
AMMAN

HEROD'S GREAT PALACE

QASR AMRA

It is desert castle in Jordan, famous for being a well-preserved example of early Islamic art and architecture, particularly its extensive secular frescoes. Built by the Umayyad caliphs, it features a reception hall and a bath complex, with unique wall paintings and a zodiac representation on a domed ceiling.



THE RUINS OF JERASH

Feel the presence of the Roman Empire in the ruins of Jerash, a once thriving Roman provincial settlement. Located north of Amman, the site features extensive ruins, including the monumental Hadrian's Arch, a large oval plaza, and impressive temples and theaters, such as the Temple of Artemis and the South Theater.



MADABA

Is the City of Mosaics. The oldest mosaic map of the Holy Land exists on the floor of Saint George's Church, and the city features many famous mosaics that exist in both public and private buildings.

THE DABKE

Is a traditional and culturally significant activity in Jordan, especially among Bedouin communities, who have a long history of horsemanship in desert life. While it's not part of everyday life for most urban Jordanians today, riding horses (and camels) remains typical in rural and desert areas, used historically for travel, herding, and ceremonial purposes. Today, it's also a popular way for visitors to experience Jordan's deserts, mountains, and historic sites, blending tradition with tourism.
