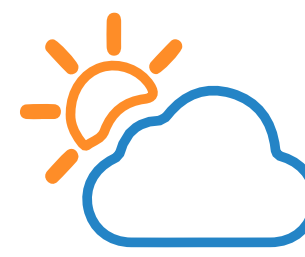

CAPITAL

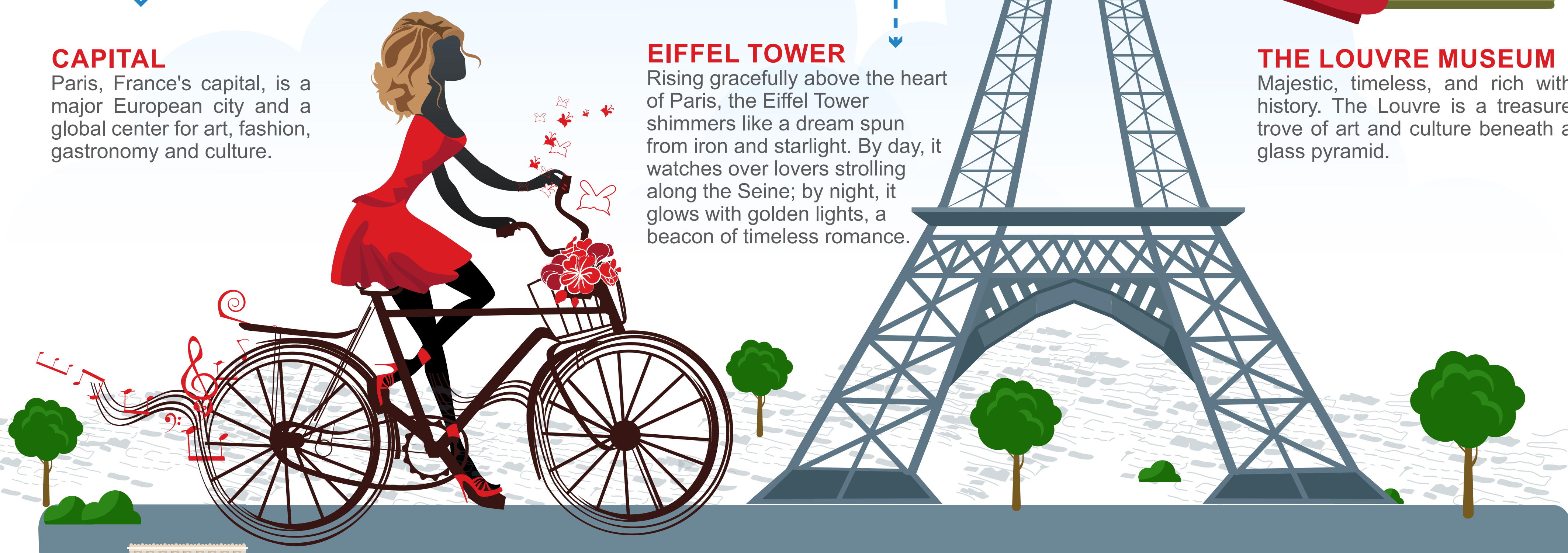
Paris, France's capital, is a major European city and a global center for art, fashion, gastronomy and culture.

Majestic, timeless, and rich with history. The Louvre is a treasure trove of art and culture beneath a glass pyramid.



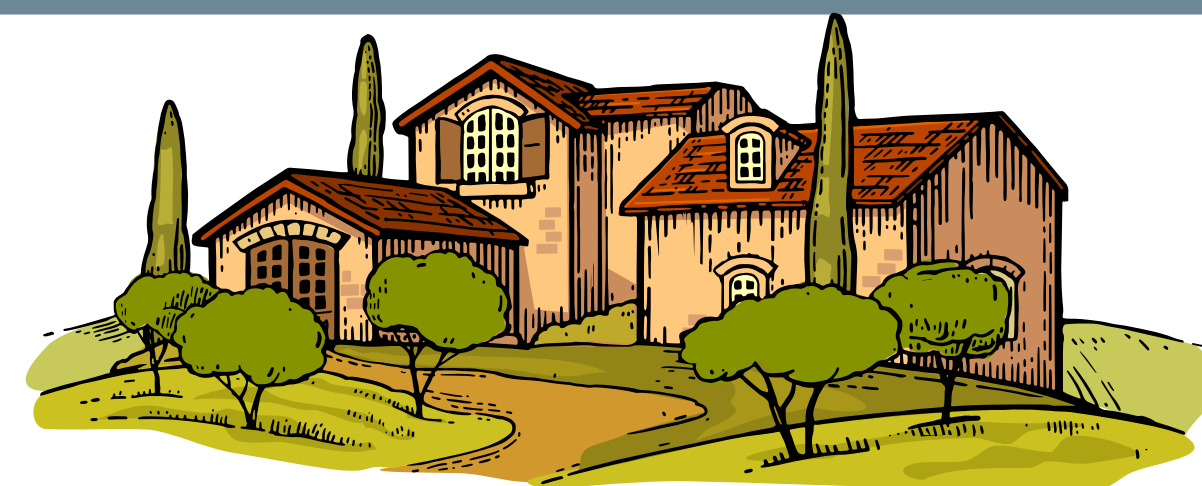
THE ARC DE TRIOMPHE

The Arc de Triomphe stands as a powerful symbol of French national pride, honoring those who fought and died for France during the French Revolutionary and Napoleonic Wars.



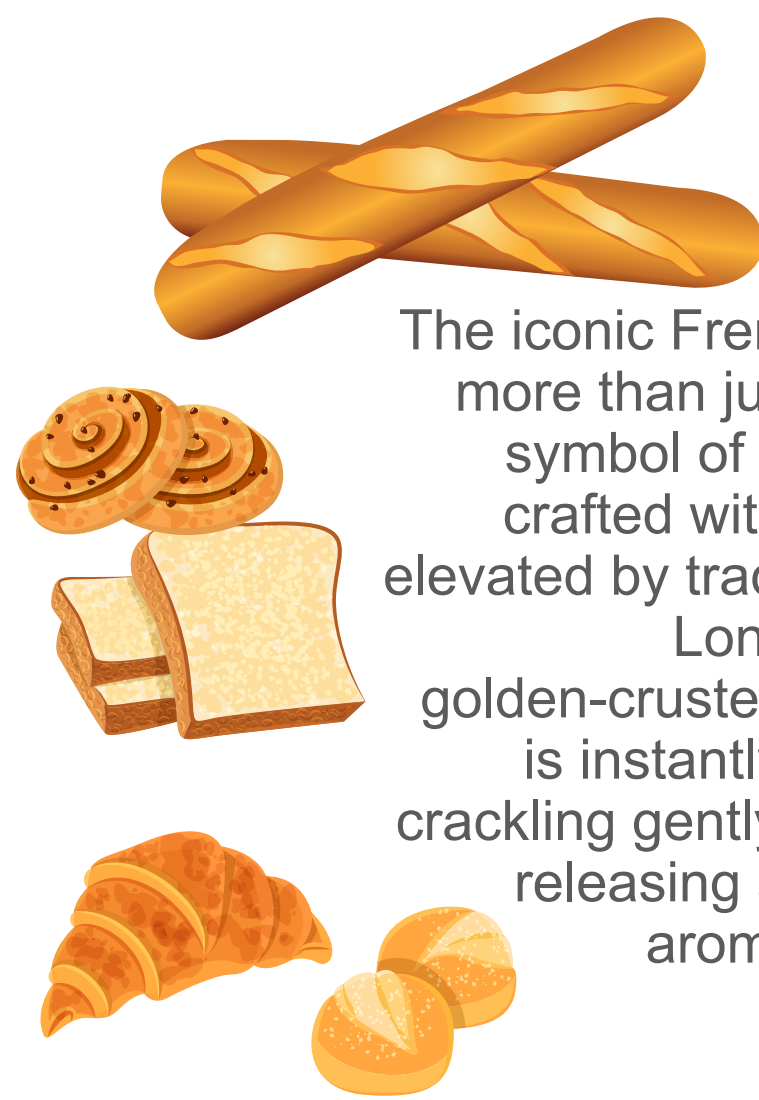
FRENCH ALPS

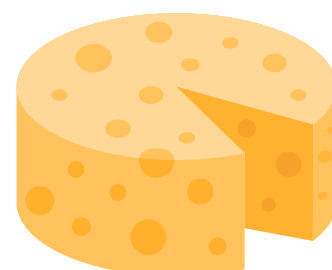
BREAD
