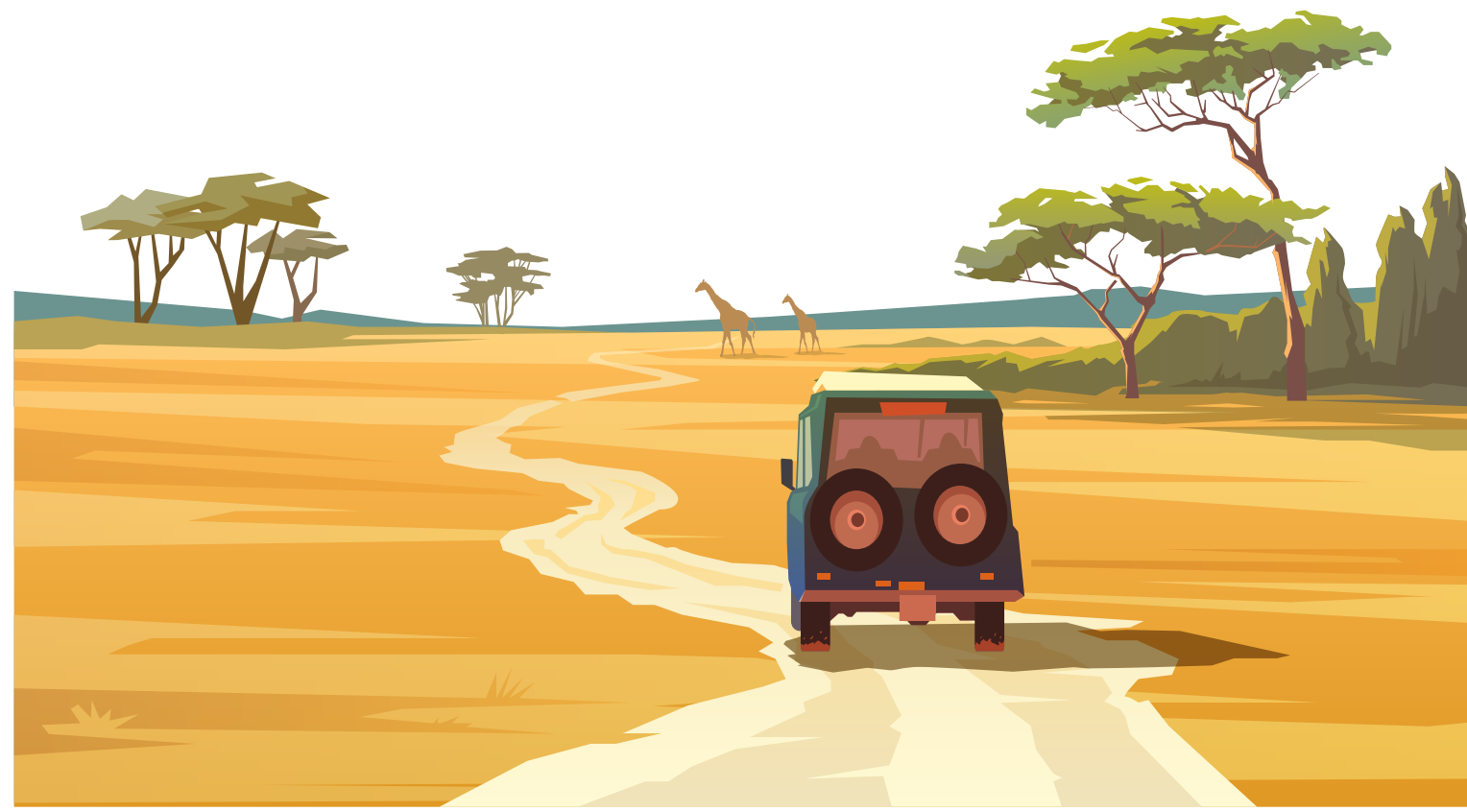

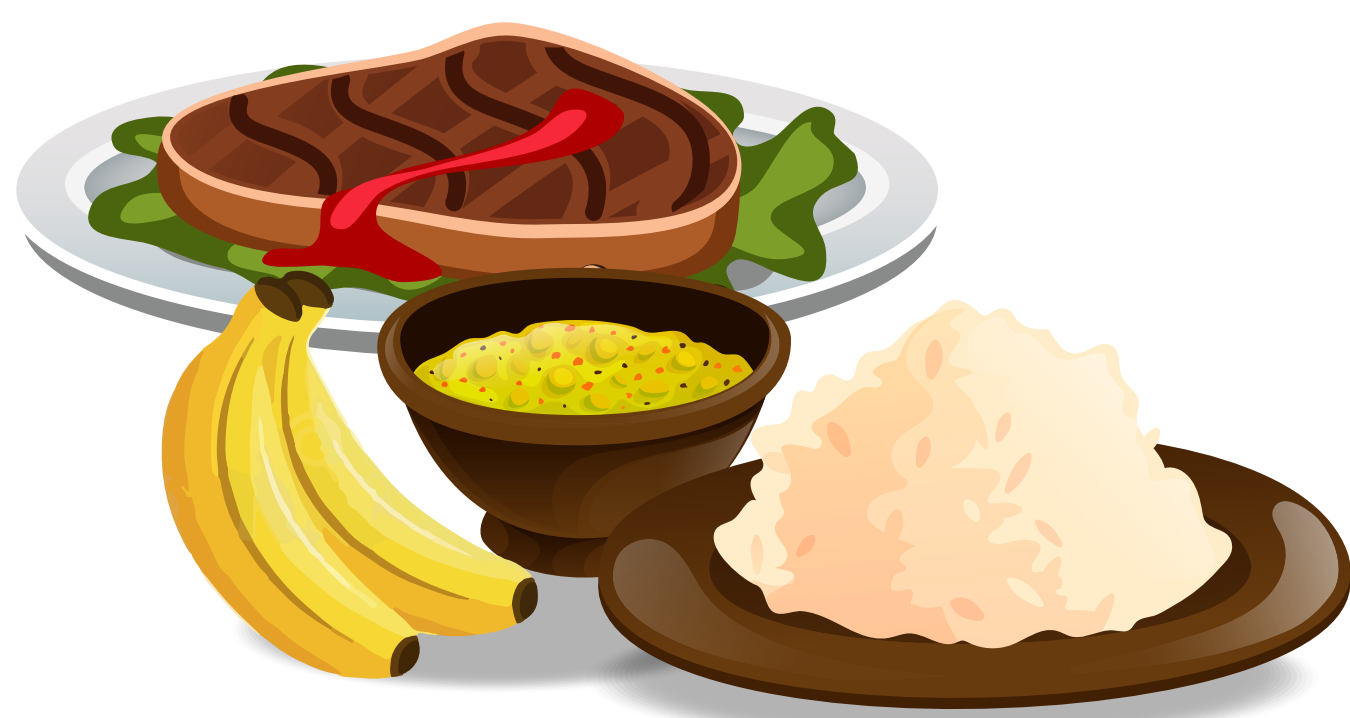
MOUNT KILIMANJARO
