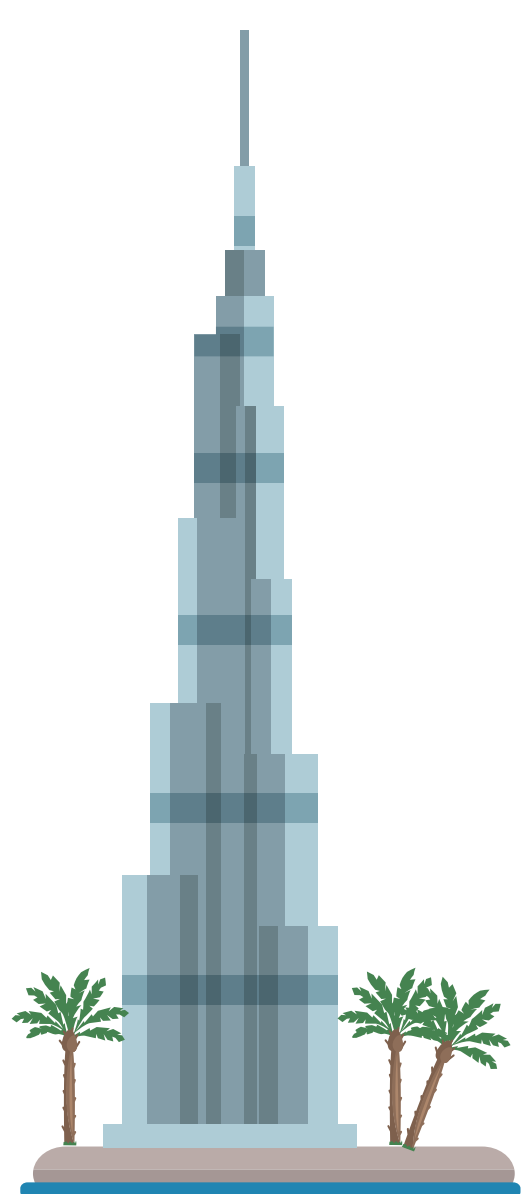

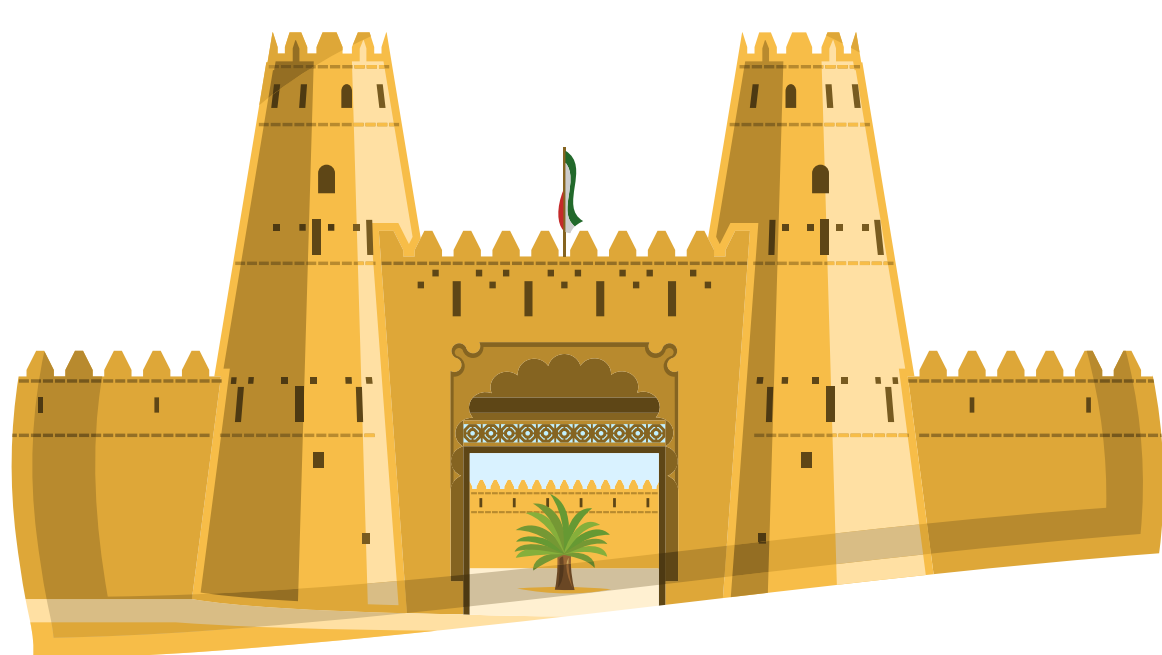
BURJ KHALIFA

DUBAI

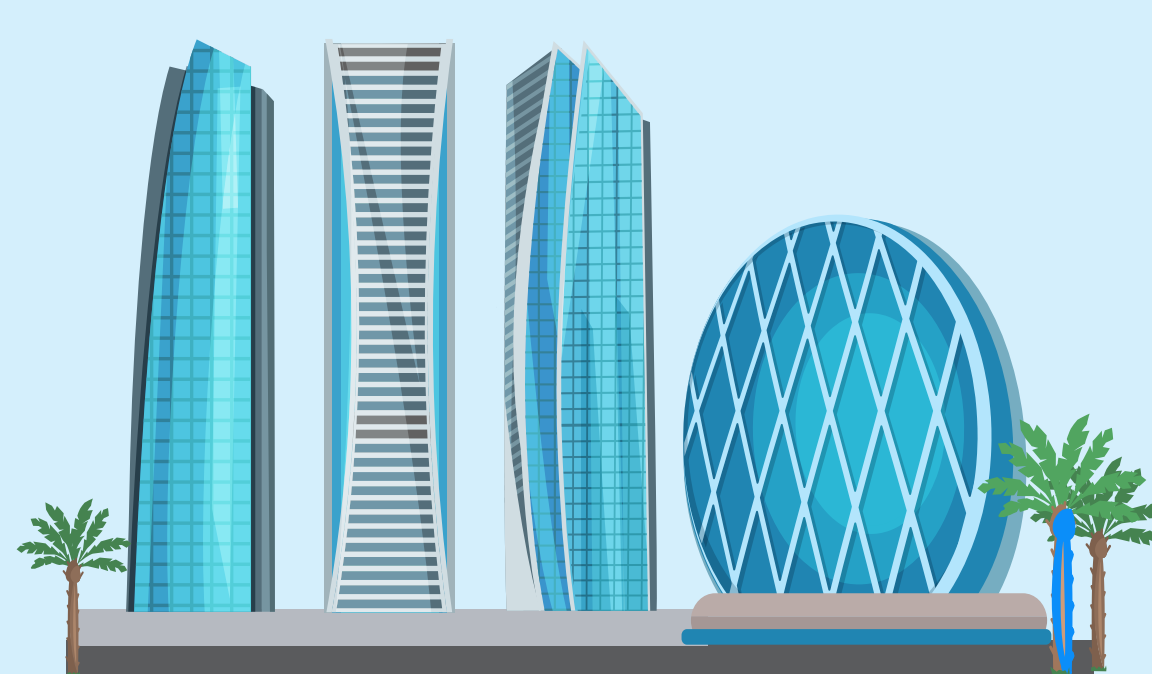
Is a city and emirate in the United Arab Emirates known for luxury shopping, ultramodern architecture and a lively nightlife scene.

It is the capital of UAE, and it is the country's largest and the second most populous city.



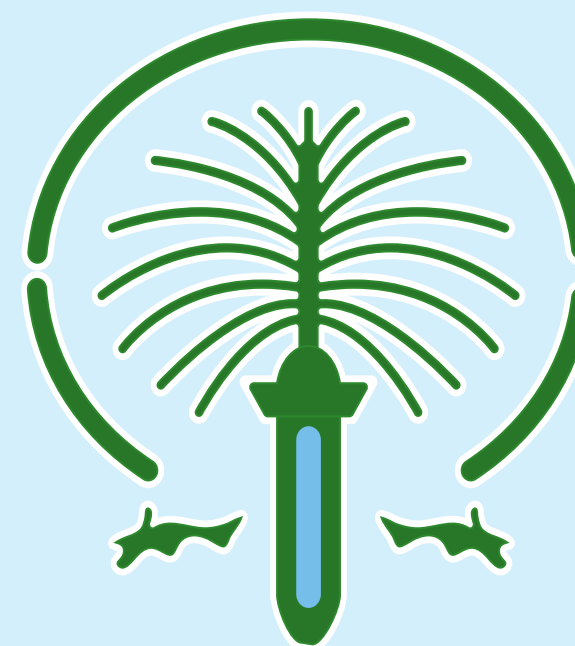
BEST TIME TO VISIT UAE

The sail-shaped, the world's tallest and only Seven-star hotel.



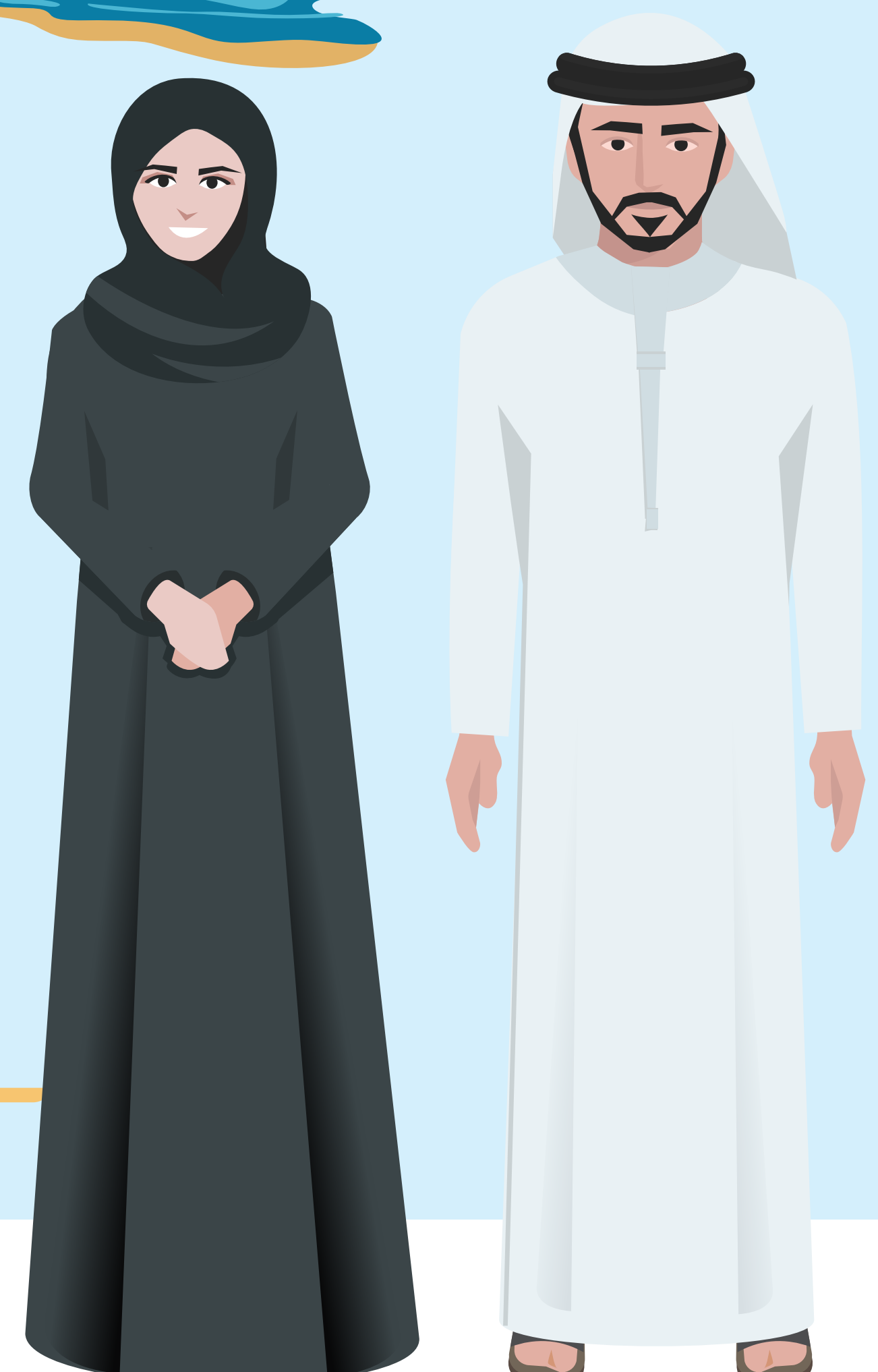
FOOD
