After landing in Bari, you'll be whisked away through the olive-dotted countryside to Lecce, a breathtaking city often called "The Lady of the Baroque." Strolling through Lecce feels like walking through a living museum, where golden stone palaces and elaborately carved facades glow in the soft southern light. Overnight in Lecce.

DAY 2 I LECCE This morning, step back in time as a local guide leads you through Lecce's atmospheric Old Town, a labyrinth of narrow streets, hidden piazzas, and ornate churches that seem to rise from the earth like sculptures. Marvel at the theatrical architecture of Santa Croce and the sun-drenched beauty of Piazza del Duomo, one of Italy's most stunning squares.

Pause to indulge in two of Lecce's most iconic treats — the velvety, almond-infused Caffè Leccese served over ice, and the flaky, cream-filled Pasticciotto, warm from the oven. The afternoon is yours to explore at your own pace: browse artisan workshops, visit a museum, or simply unwind with a glass of wine in a quiet piazza. (B)

DAY 3 I LECCE I OTRANTO I GALLIPOLI I LECCE Today, follow the sparkling Adriatic coastline to Otranto, a coastal gem crowned by its imposing Aragonese Castle and medieval walls. Wander through cobblestone alleys with sweeping sea views, and step inside the cathedral to see its rare mosaic floor — a masterpiece of medieval art. Next, enjoy wine tasting at a countryside estate, where sun-ripened grapes are transformed into full-bodied Salento wines. In the afternoon, continue to Gallipoli, a seaside haven where the historic old town rests on an island, connected to the mainland by a 17th-century bridge. every building gleams against the backdrop of olive trees and the turquoise sea. Then on to Locorotondo, a circular hilltop village wrapped in a spiral of whitewashed houses, famous for its crisp local wines and peaceful charm. Continue to the storybook town of Alberobello, a UNESCO World Heritage Site famed for its whimsical 'trulli' — cone-shaped stone dwellings that seem pulled from a fairytale. Evening arrival in Bari, where the Adriatic whispers promise of tomorrow's adventures. (B)

DAY 5 I BARI I POLIGNANO A MARE I BARI Begin your day with a guided exploration of Bari Vecchia, the vibrant old quarter of Bari, where grandmothers still hand-roll orecchiette pasta in the alleyways, and centuries of history echo through the medieval streets. Then journey south to Polignano a Mare, dramatically perched on cliffs above the Adriatic. Feel the sea breeze in your hair as you admire whitewashed buildings, sunlit terraces, and hidden coves carved into the rocky coastline. Snap a photo beside the statue of Domenico Modugno, the beloved singer of "Volare," and let your heart soar like the song itself. Return to Bari in the evening to enjoy the city's lively nightlife or unwind at your hotel. (B)

DAY 6 I BARI I MATERA I ALTAMURA I BARI Today, uncover one of Italy's most fascinating and hauntingly beautiful places — Matera, a city carved into the rock. Explore the Sassi, ancient cave dwellings turned into stylish homes and artisan shops and visit centuries-old rock churches adorned with fading frescoes. Next, travel to Altamura, a charming town renowned for its traditional PDO-certified bread, baked in wood-fired ovens using ancient grains. Discover the secrets behind this prized loaf — and taste it fresh and warm. (B)

DAY 7 I BARI TO USA (OR EXTEND YOUR STAY) Say "arrivederci" to Italy or extend your stay. (B)

Pause to admire Positano from above, its pastel houses clinging to the cliffs below the tiled dome of its church. Continue through Praiano and glimpse Furore's dramatic fjord before arriving in Amalfi. Here, wander bustling piazzas and see the magnificent St. Andrew's Cathedral with its striking mosaic façade. After time to shop and explore, travel uphill to Ravello, a tranquil village perched high above Amalfi. With its lush gardens and panoramic views, Ravello has inspired countless artists and composers, from Richard Wagner to Gore Vidal. This day along the Amalfi Coast blends natural splendor with cultural discovery. (B)

DAY 5 I SORRENTO Step back nearly two thousand years as you explore the ancient ruins of Pompeii, once a thriving Roman city frozen in time by the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 AD. Walk its paved streets, marvel at frescoed houses, visit ancient bakeries, and peer into thermopolia — the fast-food stands of the ancient world. Each corner brings the city back to life, offering an

intimate glimpse into everyday Roman life. Afterward, continue to the fertile slopes of Mount Vesuvius, where vineyards thrive in volcanic soil. Taste a flaky sfogliatella, enjoy savory almond-and-pepper taralli, and experience Naples' most iconic food — pizza, folded into quarters and eaten on the go just as locals do. End with artisanal chocolate, a tradition born of a Piedmontese chocolatier who made Naples his home. The flavors of Naples reveal the city's passion, creativity, and zest for life. (B)





- Visit Sorrento for authentic "pizza napoletana" and cross the Bay of Naples via jetfoil for some adventuring in the breathtaking Isle of Capri
- Delve into the past in Salerno and Paestum, featuring one of the best collections of Greek temples in Western Europe





DAY 1 | NAPLES | MINORI Upon arrival, you will be met and transferred to your hotel in Minori, an attractive and uncrowded seaside town at the center of a wide cove on the Amalfi Coast. A resort-like retreat among aristocratic Romans who came for the sunshine and dramatic scenery, Minori retains its identity as a laid-back fishing village. The rest of the day is at leisure. Dinner and overnight at the hotel. (D)

DAY 2 | MINORI This morning, enjoy a walking tour of Minori. Dubbed "the town of good taste" for its gastronomic delights, Minori is known for its terraced gardens that stagger up rugged hillsides filled with citrus trees. The lemons are used to make some of the tasty pastries sold in shops throughout the Amalfi Coast, but also in the production of limoncello, the area's famous liqueur. After a tasting of limoncello in a local factory, you will continue your tour with a visit of local artisan shops producing ceramics and other typical products of the area. Time to rest before taking part in a cooking class held by the hotel chef, followed by dinner. (B,D)

DAY 3 | MINORI | AMALFI | RAVELLO | MINORI Today, depart for a full day excursion to the UNESCO World Heritage towns of Amalfi and Ravello. Amalfi was once a powerful town, and the first Sea Republic in Italy, before part of it was destroyed by a tsunami in the 14th century. Walk through the town and see examples of Moorish influenced medieval architecture, such as Saint Andrew's Cathedral (Duomo) and the Cloister of Paradise. Amalfi is also known for its hand-made thick paper called "bambagina", popular with artists. Continue to the nearby charming town of Ravello, which was founded in the 5th century as shelter against barbarian invasions. By the 9th century, the town was an important trading power. Later in the afternoon, return to Minori. Dinner at the hotel. (B,D)

DAY 4 | MINORI | POMPEII | SORRENTO | POSITANO | MINORI After breakfast, depart for a full day filled with captivating sights. Drive to Pompeii, a prosperous Roman town buried under

a thick layer of ash 2,000 years ago. A guided walk through the remarkably preserved ruins of temples, houses, gardens and public buildings will be a fascinating and moving experience. Continue to Sorrento for a pizza lunch in a local restaurant before your walking tour of this lovely resort town. On your way back to Minori, stop for a view of Positano, a town of fishermen's white houses clustered around the glazed tiled dome of its church and overlooking the turquoise Mediterranean water. Dinner at the hotel. (B,L,D)

DAY 5 | MINORI | CAPRI | MINORI This morning, weather permitting, a jetfoil will whisk you across the blue Bay of Naples to the fabled Isle of Capri. Ascend by funicular to the "Piazzetta", the town center and where extravagance is the non-noticed norm. The magic of the island is everywhere. Walk by spotless narrow streets. Gaze at boutique displays. Sit at an open air cafe for lunch on your own, before returning to the pier by funicular and boarding the jetfoil back to the mainland. Dinner and overnight at the hotel. (B,D)

DAY 6 | MINORI | SALERNO | PAESTUM | MINORI

Today's excursion will be to the lively port town of Salerno. During medieval times, the town's medical school was among the most advanced in Europe. In recent history, Salerno was the site of the Allied landing in September 1942. Continue to Paestum, one of the best collections of Greek architecture in Western Europe, and see the 2000 year old Doric Temples. Next, visit a "Mozzarella di Bufala" factory to learn about the mozzarella making process, and to sample some of this delightful cheese. Return to Minori for a Farewell dinner and overnight at the hotel. (B,D)

DAY 7 | MINORI | NAPLES TO USA (OR EXTEND YOUR STAY) Morning transfer to Naples airport or railway station. (B)

At the end of the class, you will have the chance to taste what you prepared with your chef and her family. In the afternoon enjoy a tour of Nora, one of the first settlements to be founded in Sardinia by the Phoenicians, situated on a promontory just outside Pula and Southwest of Cagliari. Travel back in time as you stroll along the old-world Roman Roads and delve into the Roman Architecture. Head back to Cagliari and enjoy free time for dinner on your own. Overnight in Cagliari (B, L).

DAY 4 I CAGLIARI In the morning you will have the chance to stroll through the district of Villanova, one of the most interesting districts in town, with its art and crafts workshops and charming alleys. See "Antico Cafè", one of the oldest cafes in town, and San Giacomo and San Domenico Church before reaching San Benedetto market, the largest market in town and the core of street food in Cagliari. Walking through the market you will have a chance to taste some typical products such as the renowned mullet roe. Rest of the day at leisure. Overnight in Cagliari. (B)

DAY 5 I CAGLIARI I GERGEI I ESCOLCA I CAGLIARI After breakfast you will depart for an excursion to Sarcidano, a region of dappled landscapes forever dedicated to farming, winemaking and shepherding, that is the core and backbone of Sardinia's most genuine and heartfelt authenticity. Rising among the exquisitely nuanced plateaus, golden wheat fields, and cork oat woods that dot the countryside, this time-honored land is the cradle of Sardinian vine farming and an outpost of biodiversity in the Mediterranean. Here you will visit an estate vineyard, 30 hectares devoted to native Sardinian wine varieties among unspoiled fields where farming and shepherding traditions thrive. Learn about the estate's fascinating history and the Biointegrale philosophy, as well as an overview of their farming and winemaking practices before enjoying a leisurely, pleasurable, guided tasting of four wines. Continue your tour with a visit of a historic home from the 1800s in Gergei, made comfortable thanks to a respectful restoration. Here while learning how milk is transformed into cheese using age old techniques for the creation of cheese, you will taste different kinds of cheese, from the strongest and saltiest to the freshest and sweetest, accompanied by cold cuts, honey, jams, and select wines. End the tour in Escolca with a visit of an oil mill and ethnographic museum. DAY 4 | PISTOIA | PISA | LUCCA | PISTOIA Today you will visit two more Tuscan treasures: Pisa and Lucca. Gateway to the Tuscan hills, Pisa is a medieval city of architectural masterpieces, and in its heyday, one of Italy's most powerful maritime republics. Native son Galileo Galilei may be long gone, but students still come here to study at the prestigious university where he once

taught. During your guided tour you will see Pisa's symbol - the Leaning Tower. Originally intended as a bell tower it's the most well-known of the buildings comprising the Campo dei Miracoli, or Field of Miracles. The site of Galileo's gravitational experiments, the tower began to tilt even before it was finished and the angle has increased over time. 



Optional air transportation is not included (unless otherwise noted). However, if optional air transportation is purchased, then the fuel surcharge, all security fees, airport taxes and fees and/or any other governmental or local taxes and fees will be included. Airfares provided at the time of deposit are subject to change until full payment is received and the ticket is issued. Some airfares may require instant purchase and are subject to the respective airline's regulations, terms and conditions of purchase. We strongly recommend you purchase air transportation through Central Holidays. In case of a human or computer billing error, we reserve the right to re-invoice for the correct amount. A full refund will be made to passengers not willing to pay increases, provided the passengers' written cancellation is received by us (Central Holidays), in writing, within 5 business days after price increase notification. We do not itemize costs of individual services included in an itinerary.
- PAYMENTS & CANCELLATIONS:
 3.A. DEPOSITS: A \$300.00 per person non-refundable deposit is required at the time of booking and NO request will be acted upon until a deposit is received (Acceptance clause 1.) Additional deposits or payments might be needed as required by the supplier of the service (Villa Rental, Cruises, Lodges, exclusive venues, etc.). We honor most major credit cards. No third-party credit cards will be accepted. In addition, we also accept personal checks or agency checks. 5.I. TRANSFERS Except where indicated, transfers to/from

In case you miss your flight or a connection, you must work with the specific airline and make all the possible arrangements to reach your final destination. Central Holidays is not responsible for any additional expenses you may incur because of flight cancellations, flight delays or rescheduled, missed flights after airport check-in. B.
