




DAY 1 - SUNDAY - JOHANNESBURG Upon arrival in Johannesburg, you'll be met and transferred to your hotel. Johannesburg is the largest and most populous city in South Africa. Situated on the mineral-rich Witwatersrand range of hills, it is also the source of a large-scale gold and diamond trade. Enjoy the remainder of your day at leisure.

DAY 2 - MONDAY - JOHANNESBURG - MPUMALANGA

Depart Johannesburg after breakfast and head for Pretoria, South Africa's capital city. Have an orientation tour before continuing on to the Mpumalanga Province, known as "Paradise Country." Descend several hundred feet into the lush subtropical region of the Lowveld passing through the historic towns of Dullstroom and Lydenburg. Then traverse the famous Long Tom Pass and arrive late this afternoon in Hazyview, the safari hub of Kruger National Park. (B)

DAY 3 - TUESDAY - MPUMALANGA After an early morning breakfast, drive along the spectacular "Panorama Route," featuring views of amazing scenery including the 26 kilometer-long Blyde River Canyon (home to the Three Rondavels), Bourke's Luck Potholes, and God's Window at the edge of Kruger National Park. Arrive back in Hazyview in the early afternoon where the remainder of your day is at leisure to relax or join an afternoon game experience (optional). (B)

DAY 4 - WEDNESDAY - MPUMALANGA Enjoy an early morning coffee or tea, and with your pre-packaged breakfast ready to go, embark on a thrilling open vehicle safari led by your English-speaking game ranger through one of the world's greatest national parks, Kruger National Park - home to a stunning array of wildlife. Search for the 'Big Five' - rhinos, buffalos, lions, leopards, and elephants - as well as prolific birdlife and numerous other game. Enjoy your afternoon at leisure. (B)

DAY 5 - THURSDAY - MPUMALANGA - ESWATINI (SWAZILAND)

Have This morning, travel to Swaziland, an independent Kingdom within the borders of South Africa, known for its lovely scenery, crafts, and colorful indigenous culture. An interactive cultural experience introduces you to the charming people of Swaziland and their traditions. Continue on to the beautiful Ezulwini Valley for a true African shopping experience at the Ezulwini Craft Market, brimming with woven baskets, beadwork, and carvings. Overnight in Swaziland. (B,L,D)

DAY 6 - FRIDAY - ESWATINI (SWAZILAND) - HLUHLUWE-IMFOLOZI Continue After breakfast, venture through Swaziland before heading back to South Africa. Travel into Zululand, passing traditional round huts and endless vistas. Consider joining an optional afternoon open vehicle safari in the Hluhluwe-Umfolozi Game Reserve, famous for its conservation of black and white rhino. Enjoy an overnight stay in the Hluhluwe-Umfolozi region. (B)

DAY 7 - SATURDAY - HLUHLUWE-IMFOLOZI - DURBAN

Rise and shine with a hearty breakfast before embarking on a cruise along Lake St. Lucia (weather permitting). Next, journey past traditional Zulu Kraals, eucalyptus plantations, and sugar cane fields to arrive in Durban. Enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure to bask on the golden beaches of the Indian Ocean. Overnight in Durban. (B)

DAY 8 - SUNDAY - DURBAN - KNYSNA After breakfast, take a short flight to Port Elizabeth and then set off to explore the magnificent beauty of the indigenous Tsitsikamma Forest. Arrive at your hotel in Knysna, nestled on the banks of a beautiful lagoon in the heart of the Garden Route. Overnight in Knysna. (B)

DAY 9 - MONDAY - KNYSNA After a leisurely breakfast, visit the spectacular Tsitsikamma National Park, Storms River Mouth (weather permitting) and the magical Knysna Forests, the stamping ground of the elusive Knysna elephants. Your afternoon is at leisure to further explore this charming town. (B,L,D)

DAY 10 - TUESDAY - KNYSNA - OUDTSHOORN Power up with breakfast before heading out through the Outeniqua Pass to Oudtshoorn, center of the world's Ostrich farming industry. Tour an Ostrich Farm and enjoy a light lunch before taking a tour of the spectacular limestone caverns of Cango Caves. Arrive at your hotel in the late afternoon. Overnight in Oudtshoorn. (B,L)

DAY 11 - WEDNESDAY - OUDTSHOORN - CAPE TOWN After breakfast, the adventure continues as you travel through the "Little Karoo" to Barrydale. DAY 12 - THURSDAY - CAPE TOWN Have breakfast to start your day and get ready to explore with a full day at leisure. Consider joining an optional sightseeing tour to Table Mountain or simply experience the city on your own. The relatively small city of Cape Town is packed with sightseeing attractions, bars, cafes, and restaurants as well as colorful craft markets. Alternately, you can opt to relax on one of Cape Town's many pristine beaches. Enjoy an evening of delicious Cape food, captivating theater, and entertaining tales and songs about the people of the Cape. Overnight in Cape Town. (B,D)

DAY 13 - FRIDAY - CAPE TOWN Enjoy breakfast before embarking on a full day tour of the Cape Peninsula, featuring some of the most spectacular coastal scenery in the world. Drive through Sea Point, the seaside village of Hout Bay, where you can enjoy a Seal Island boat cruise (optional) and then head on to Cape Point where it is said that the Atlantic and Indian Oceans meet. Return to Cape Town by way of Simon's Town where you can visit the Penguin colony at Boulders Beach, then see Fish Hoek fishing village and Muizenberg. Overnight in Cape Town. (B)

DAY 14 - SATURDAY - CAPE TOWN TO USA (OR EXTEND YOUR STAY) Wake to this glorious day with a full breakfast and then get ready to enjoy some last-minute shopping or sightseeing at your own pace. Consider joining The Robben Island Tour (optional), which departs from the Victoria & Alfred Waterfront. Later you will be transferred to the airport, harbor, or railway station for your onward journey. (B)

Blyde River Canyon

DAY 2 – MONDAY - JOHANNESBURG - MPUMALANGA
Depart Johannesburg after breakfast and head for South Africa's capital city of Pretoria for a short orientation tour before continuing on to Mpumalanga Province, known as Paradise Country. Dropping several hundred feet into the lush subtropical region of the Lowveld, you will travel through the historic towns of Dullstroom and Lydenburg. After heading across the famous Long Tom Pass, travel via Sabie into Hazyview, the safari hub of Kruger National Park. (B)

DAY 3 – TUESDAY - MPUMALANGA After an early morning breakfast, drive along the spectacular Panorama Route that offers views of amazing scenery including the 26 km-long Blyde River Canyon (home to the Three Rondavels), Bourke's Luck Potholes' and historic God's Window, a breathtaking view (weather permitting) of the edge of the escarpment taking in Kruger National Park. Arrive back in Hazyview in the late afternoon, where the remainder of the day is at leisure to relax. (B)

DAY 4 – WEDNESDAY - MPUMALANGA Begin this spectacular day with early morning coffee or tea, followed by a thrilling open vehicle safari led by your English-speaking game ranger. Enjoy a pre-packed breakfast and experience the awe-inspiring views as you traverse Kruger National Park, one of the world's greatest national parks and home to a stunning array of wildlife. Search for the "Big Five" – rhino, buffalo, lion, leopard, and elephant – as well as prolific birdlife and numerous other animals. DAY 6 – FRIDAY - ESWATINI (SWAZILAND) - HLUHLUWE-IMFOLOZI After breakfast, continue south through Eswatini before re-entering South Africa. Travel into Zululand, passing traditional round huts and endless breathtaking nature vistas. Embark on an afternoon open vehicle safari with an English-speaking game ranger in the Hluhluwe-Imfolozi Game Reserve. This game reserve contains an immense diversity of fauna and flora and is particularly famous for its conservation of black and white rhino. Tonight, you will stay in the Hluhluwe-Imfolozi region. (B)

DAY 7 – SATURDAY - HLUHLUWE-IMFOLOZI - DURBAN
Start your day with breakfast before joining a cruise on Lake St Lucia (weather permitting) and then depart towards Durban. Today's journey will take you past traditional Zulu Kraals, Eucalyptus plantations, and sugar cane fields. Arrive in Durban in the early afternoon. (B)

DAY 8 – SUNDAY - DURBAN Rise and shine with breakfast at your hotel and then stroll along the "Golden Mile" revitalized beachfront promenade. Your tour will take you through the city, viewing the majestic City Hall and enjoying its history. Savor the traditional food and wine of Stellenbosch as your guide leads you through the historic heart of this vibrant university town. Visit the oldest restored townhouse in South Africa, then, enjoy an indigenous tasting of tea and rusks. Join a wine tasting experience before a flavorful lunch featuring South African favorites, and then check in to your hotel. (B,L)

DAY 5 – STELLENBOSCH Rise and shine for the ultimate day of celebrating the exceptional Winelands Region and its heavenly scenery. Here you will experience a wine cellar tour and tasting where you'll learn all about the process of winemaking— from

grape to goblet. Visit the exquisite little town of Franschhoek and pass by the impressive Huguenot Monument. Enjoy a wine tasting at two different wine estates where you can opt to purchase your favorite wine to take back home. (B)

DAY 6 – STELLENBOSCH - EASTERN CAPE After breakfast, head to Cape Town International Airport for your flight to Port Elizabeth. A natural extension to Cape Town and the Garden Route, Kariega features almost 25,000 acres of pristine wilderness offering unforgettable game drives and a diversity of unique activities, including guided bush walks, river cruises, canoeing, fishing, and visits to nearby beaches. (B,D)

DAY 7 – EASTERN CAPE This morning opt to depart on an early morning game drive or perhaps a river cruise. Return to your lodge for breakfast/brunch. Next, you can experience a bush walk, enjoy a spa treatment, go canoeing, have a swim, or just relax at the lodge. 


TANZANIA

ZIMBABWE



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR TRAVELERS

SOUTH AFRICA

South Africa is known for its unique setup of three capital cities Pretoria (administrative), Cape Town (legislative), and Bloemfontein (judicial). It is also well recognized for its extraordinary biodiversity, including the Cape Floristic Region, one of the richest floral kingdoms on Earth. Travelers can experience everything from "tablecloth" cloud over Table Mountain to Kruger National Park with some of Africa's best Big Five viewings, while the Cape Winelands provide world-class wines among stunning landscapes. US Travelers generally do not need a visa for stays up to 90 days. Passports should have at least two blank pages and enough remaining validity. If you arrive from (or transit through) a yellow fever-risk country, you must show a yellow fever vaccination certificate.

Malaria risk is present in certain regions (e.g., Kruger, Limpopo), so malaria prophylaxis may be recommended depending on your itinerary.



KENYA

Kenya is the birthplace of the word "safari," offering classic wildlife experiences and hosting the beginning of the Great Migration in the Maasai Mara. It's home to the culturally vibrant Maasai people and the world-renowned long-distance runners of the Rift Valley. Visitors can explore Mt. Kenya, Africa's second-highest peak, and experience Nairobi, the only capital city with a fully functioning national park on its doorstep.

Travelers to the destination need to apply for an Electronic Travel Authorization online (eTA) before arrival. For health/entry requirements, a yellow fever vaccine is required only if you're coming from a country with yellow fever risk. Recommended vaccines include hepatitis A, hepatitis B, typhoid, and staying up to date on routine immunizations (MMR, polio, etc.). Malaria prophylaxis is advised for many parts of Kenya.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR TRAVELERS

TANZANIA

Tanzania boasts Africa's highest peak, Mount Kilimanjaro, and the legendary Serengeti, whose name comes from a Maasai word meaning "endless plains." The country is rich in natural wonders, including the wildlife-dense Ngorongoro Crater and the unique tree-climbing lions of Lake Manyara. Offshore, Zanzibar's Spice Island heritage provides fragrant tours and historic charm, while Lake Tanganyika offers some of the world's oldest and deepest waters.

US citizens need a visa, which you can typically get via an e-Visa or on arrival (depending on your nationality). Your passport must generally be valid for at least 6 months and have at least one blank page.

A yellow fever vaccination certificate is mandatory if you're arriving from or transiting through a yellow fever endemic. For recommended health precautions, consider routine immunizations (MMR, polio, tetanus), plus hepatitis A/B, typhoid, and malaria prophylaxis depending on your itinerary.

Also note: if you're traveling to Zanzibar, travel insurance is now mandatory.


ZIMBABWE

Zimbabwe is home to one of the world's most iconic natural wonders, Victoria Falls, known as Mosi- oa-Tunya ("The Smoke That Thunders"). The country also offers rich wildlife experiences in Hwange National Park and Mana Pools, plus cultural landmarks such as the Great Zimbabwe Ruins and scenic regions like the Eastern Highlands. Visitors can expect a blend of natural beauty, ancient history, and warm local hospitality.

U.S. citizens generally need a visa, obtainable online (e-Visa) or on arrival at major entry points. Passports should be valid for at least 6 months and have two blank pages.

A yellow fever vaccination certificate is required only if you're arriving from or transiting through a yellow-fever-risk country.

Travelers should be up to date on routine immunizations (MMR, polio, tetanus), with hepatitis A, hepatitis B, and typhoid recommended depending on activities.

ACCEPTANCE: The purchase/payment of any travel services offered by Central Holidays constitutes a contractual arrangement between the Passenger and/or Travel Agent (all together as "You") and SGI US LLC (dba CENTRAL HOLIDAYS & affiliated brands) ("Central Holidays") and represents your acceptance of SGI US LLC Terms and Conditions ("Terms and Conditions"). You are required to read and acknowledge the Terms and Conditions on our website before making any reservation with us. Payment of deposit and/or final payment will be considered as full, explicit and implicit acceptance of our Terms and Conditions herein reported and fully disclosed on our website. Each Passenger understands that Central Holidays will be accepting that Passenger's reservation in trust upon such Passenger's acceptance of the Terms and Conditions as outlined in this brochure and on our website.

2. TOUR PRICES/PRICE GUARANTEE: Prices are based on official rates of exchange at the time of Quote. Once we have received your full payment for any program/reservation, the price is guaranteed. Optional air transportation is not included (unless otherwise noted). However, if optional air transportation is purchased, then the fuel surcharge, all security fees, airport taxes and fees and/or any other governmental or local taxes and fees will be included. Airfares provided at the time of deposit are subject to change until full payment is received and the ticket is issued. Some airfares may require instant purchase and are subject to the respective airline's regulations, terms and conditions of purchase. We strongly recommend you purchase air transportation through Central Holidays. In case of a human or computer billing error, we reserve the right to re-invoice for the correct amount. 3. PAYMENTS & CANCELLATIONS:

3.A. DEPOSITS: A \$300.00 per person non-refundable deposit is required at the time of booking and NO request will be acted upon until a deposit is received (Acceptance clause 1.). Passengers will be advised at the time of booking of payment requirements and obligations. If payment is not received by the determined due date, Central Holidays reserves the right to re-price or cancel the booking and will apply the assessed cancellation penalties accordingly. Please note that Terms and Conditions can change, and deposits and final payment represents your acceptance of the Terms and Conditions. 5.D. SIGHTSEEING & OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS Sightseeing is included as per "Included Features" (on Escorted programs) and is under the direction of licensed local guides where required. 6. TRAVEL INFO & RESTRICTIONS:

A. OWN FLIGHT ARRANGEMENTS: If you purchase your own flight tickets from companies other than Central Holidays, Central Holidays is not responsible for the cancellation fees of air tickets if Central Holidays cancels a departure for any reason whatsoever, including a cancellation of a pledged departure for lack of participation or force majeure. Passengers are also responsible for the validity of their passports, and we suggest checking with U.S. Department of State Rules/Regulations. 6.C. BAGGAGE HANDLING The passenger is required to check with their respective airline for baggage allowance size, weight and excess baggage fees. Portage is included at hotels ONLY ON ESCORTED TOURS and includes handling of one normal-sized suitcase per person. Wheeled carry-on cases are considered a normal piece of luggage. Such occurrences must be promptly notified to and acknowledged by a recognized transport authority in writing. Airport/train station portage is not included, unless otherwise specified in your travel documents. Be prepared to carry your own suitcase on and off airplanes and trains and through airports and train stations. Regulations within most airports require travelers to handle their own luggage through customs. Central Holidays is not responsible for additional fees imposed by air carriers for baggage, and these fees are not included in the air-inclusive vacation price. You will be required to pay these fees directly to the airline at check-in. No responsibility is accepted by Central Holidays for loss of or damage to baggage or any of the traveler's belongings throughout the duration of the vacation. Travel Protection is highly recommended.

6.D. TRAVEL DOCUMENTS Central Holidays' communications and documentation are paperless. Thus, we will be issuing e-documents whenever possible. Printed documents will require an additional fee. Documents are sent out 2-3 weeks prior to departure date provided payment in full has been received in a timely

fashion. We can only deliver paper documents to physical addresses and not to P.O. Boxes. Overnight, Special Delivery, Saturday Delivery and shipments outside the continental USA are subject to additional shipping fees. Added fees are applicable if the issuance of documents is requested earlier than proposed. It is the responsibility of the Travel Agent/Passenger to review the shipping address for accuracy prior to documents being sent. Due to the fluctuating restrictions imposed by local governments and international destinations to curb the spread of the global COVID-19 pandemic, Travel Documents verification processes and requirements are the sole responsibility of the Passenger. Local, government and other resources are readily available online as well as on airline websites.

6.E. GRATUITIES Gratuities for your Tour Director, Local Hosts, Local Guides, driver, ship's crew and all other local service personnel are not included in the vacation price (unless otherwise noted in pricing details) and are discretionary.

7. REFUNDS & COMPLAINTS: All inquiries must be received in our Customer Relations Department either by email or USPS to our offices within 30 days after the scheduled return date and will be promptly acknowledged. However, related processing, verifications and settlements may take up to 60 days or longer. You are responsible for documenting potential claims at the Point of Service in order for claim/refund consideration. No refunds will be made on any unused portion/services of any tour package (3.E). Complaints regarding a hotel's standards or amenities should be addressed directly with the hotel's management (Point of Service). Refunds are not normally considered by hotels if they were not given an opportunity to address those complaints locally. Airline flight cancellations and delays for any reason are not the responsibility of Central Holidays. The refund/reservation requirement for airlines does not apply to tickets booked through third party agents. Whenever applicable and possible, refunds are processed in the same form of payment received. These terms may not be changed by anyone other than an authorized representative of Central Holidays and must be documented in writing. Central Holidays is not obliged to guarantee promises (written or verbal) made by local hotel staff, tour guides, or any other persons not under direct employ of Central Holidays.
