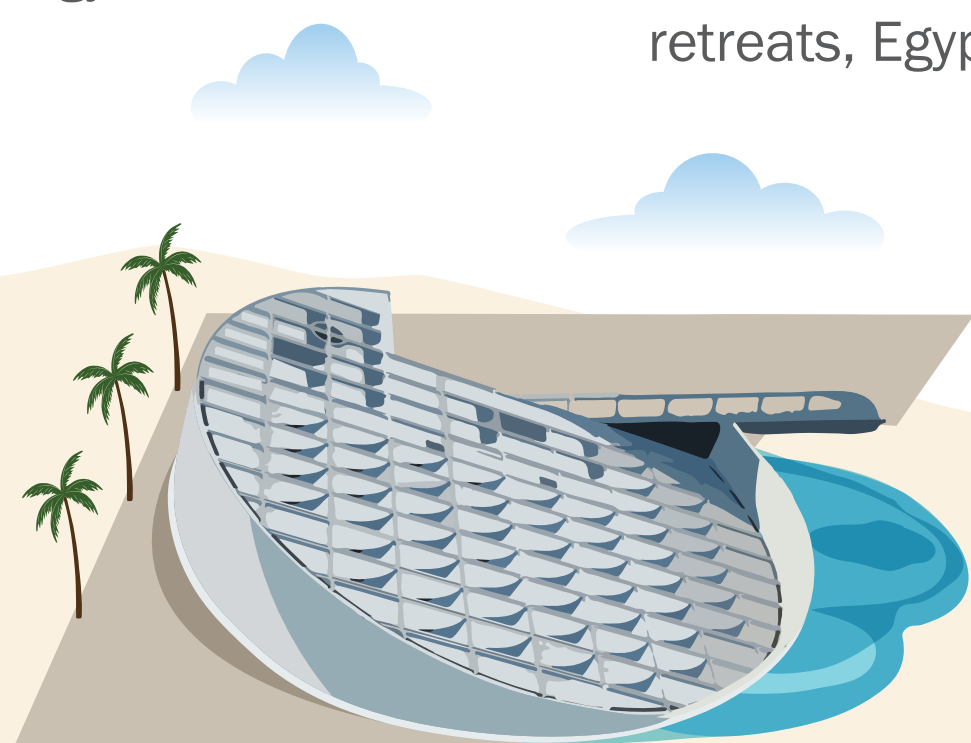
Food

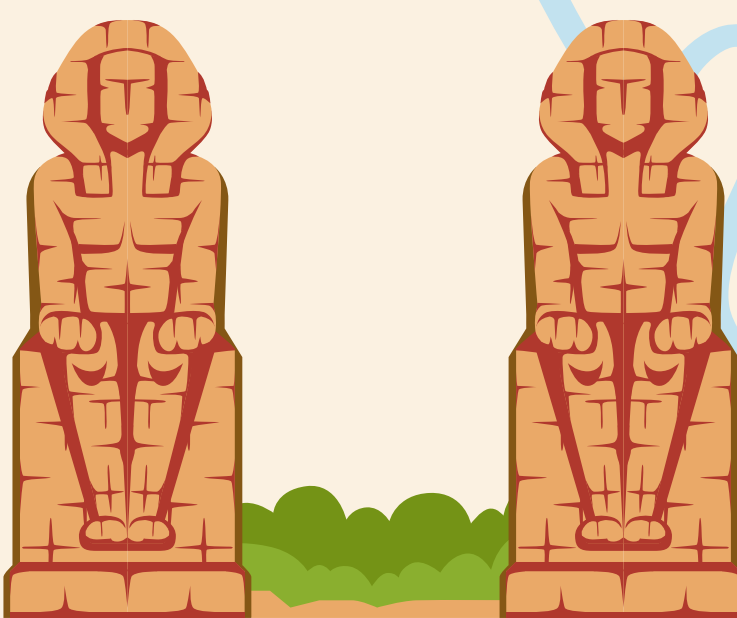
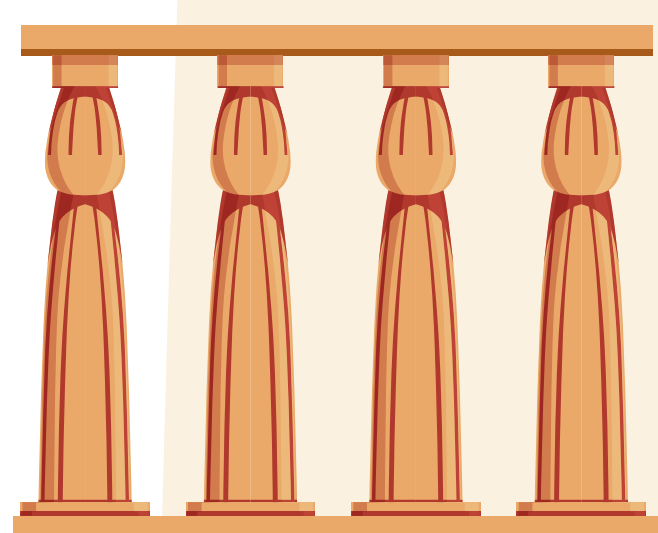
THE RED SEA
