how to write a synthesis essay introduction from [cheap paper writing service](#) remember a synthesis essay is an argumentative essay it has to have a thesis statement one that supports a claim or a statement of opinion in a synthesis essay you need to support the claim by presenting a variety of supporting evidence such as facts observations statistics the opinions of experts relevant anecdotes and much more the ideas in the information you need to be presented logically the goal of a synthesis essay is to convince readers that you understand the essay assignment and that you can apply both your own ideas and other ideas you found in reliable sources to build a persuasive argument in your synthesis essay introduction you need four major components you need a hook that is a sentence that captures your readers attention you need background information this will provide readers with an overview of your topic the third item that you need is to explain why your topic is controversial right now or why is it still relevant and the last thing that you need is your thesis statement it is your topic claim and your major reasons that you're going to support throughout your essay here are some examples of hooks that you can use it can be a definition a quotation or paraphrase a little-known or striking fact a statement of opinion that you intend to challenge and interest an incident or anecdote related to your subject an explanation of why the topic is worth reading or writing about a question that will be answered by your thesis or will catch the reader's attention and lead towards your thesis topic background information provide readers with three to six sentences on the background of your topic basically you're just giving an overview of the issue here's a tip do not go into your argument or start defending your thesis save this for your supporting paragraphs one sentence it should be dedicated to answering or briefly given an overview of why your topic is controversial or still relevant today why is this important it reassures your reader why they should continue to read on in your essay your thesis statement is the roadmap to your essay for further information you can view the video below or click into the PowerPoint to learn how to write a thesis now let's take a look at a sample introduction standardized test the unnecessary part of education we have all heard the familiar phrase be sure to study for the test but have you ever wondered how those standardized tests really play a role in your education or even your well-being that's the hook standardized test took precedent in 2002 following the No Child Left Behind Act this Act required yearly growth by schools or else they risk the chance of losing funding shutdown or being taken over by the state consequently the students in the United States slipped from the eighteenth rate in the world to the 27th in 2012 the introduction of the No Child Left Behind Act also caused deep spending on tests in education to rise more by more than a hundred and sixty percent from previous years the later overhaul of this act and the race to the top program from Obama's presidency also work to increase the promised use of the test scores standardized testing so here is your overview that's your background information now we're gonna go into why is it still relevant standardized testing continues to be a relevant topic in the world of
