In this mission, we refer to those we serve as "women and people", alternating between the pronouns "she" and "they". We recognise that our products can serve anyone with a female-assigned reproductive system – whether or not they identify as a woman. We also do this to recognise that we are speaking to allies – partners and families of those making these decisions.

To inform our mission, we conducted workshops and interviews with internal stakeholders, as well as women and people across the UK, US, and Spain, some of our key markets, between the ages of 18 to 39. We intentionally created and facilitated space for honest, in depth conversations. We spoke about life, their sexual health challenges and triumphs, and really listened in finding solutions to support them. With 100 hours of conversation, we know this provides us with just a snapshot of the full range of people who might seek out our products, and we will continue to listen to them as their needs change. We thank them for their time and vulnerability.

The first pill is approved by the FDA.

1967

France lifts the ban on birth control methods, including oral contraception.

2006

FDA approves the first OTC emergency contraception option for women 18 and older.

2010

Spain begins subsidizing hormonal contraceptives to expand access to birth control.

2020

Belgium reforms their law to make all contraceptives for women under 25 reimbursable by the government.

2021

France makes contraception - from the pill, to IUDs and other methods - free for women aged 25 and under.

2022

Free contraception is made available for women aged 17 to 25 in Ireland.

2023

France makes condoms free for everyone under the age of 26 and provides free emergency contraception for all women.

1965

US Supreme Court strikes down state laws banning birth control use by married couples.

1999

Launch of NorLevo®, hormonal emergency contraception.

2009

Launch of ellaOne® Rx, a second generation of emergency contraception.

2015

ellaOne® goes OTC - one of only 3 companies in history to perform a centralized switch in the EU

2021

Launch of Hana in the UK, a first-in-class OTC switch of a progesterone only pill (POP). POP are made available to buy in pharmacies without a prescription.

2022

Sexual health laws in Spain are reformed to ensure that emergency oral contraception is available free in sexual health centers, and must be available in all pharmacies.

2022

Application for Opill to be offered OTC submitted to the FDA.

Having listened to them, we have learned some hard truths...

We know that on a global scale, women and people are kept in the dark when it comes to their own sexual health. Very often, a lack of information combined with lack of access to products and solutions means people are left to figure it out on their own. And they are. We've heard that they're scraping together information from whatever sources they can, filling in the gaps themselves where traditional healthcare is failing. We understand that their pursuit of authentic wellness is burdened with a lack of safety and control over their own body.





The wall of challenges can feel endless, from gatekeepers, lack of research, to cultural taboos. The story of sexual health has been anchored in tradition. In a system that was not designed for them and is often failing them.

It is long overdue that women's sexual health is not only prioritized, but championed. At Perrigo, we believe that people need to be equipped with factual, relevant information and unrestricted access to choice because determining one's own sexual health journey is a fundamental human right.

Having heard from them directly, we see clearly that women and people are multifaceted and dynamic, and their sexual health care should reflect that. Although we are excited about the progress made to date, we know there are more voices we need to listen to, more learning and research to do in order to keep this movement going forward...

Perrigo are allies to women and people's sexual health journeys.

We have been pushing the boundaries of people's access to sexual health for decades.

We are the reliable, trusted partner for their sexual health journey.

We are here for everyone, and our ambition is to prioritize those from neglected and underserved communities.

We prioritise solutions that give her control, are safe and effective, and we commit to being transparent and authentic with them. We know that access and education are the non-negotiables to ensure women and people have full control over their sexual health and are supported in their pursuit of self care.

We know the science behind sexual health, and endeavour to take the time to understand the women and people we serve. We don't have all the answers yet, but are committed to forming ongoing relationships with them so we can understand them better, so we can offer what they need, and never what we think they need.

We know there is a steep learning curve for us to fully serve them across their sexual health journey, but we have the ambition to share this with the world, championing the unique circumstances and needs of each individual, no matter where they are from.

Our Groundbreaking Portfolio

- O1 We are a pioneer in emergency contraception, first with NorLevo®, which was the first emergency contraceptive that was granted direct pharmacy access in France in 1999.
- O2 We developed ellaOne®, which contains the active ingredient known to be safe and most effective for emergency hormonal contraception. [4] The preferred choice for women and people in many countries around the world. [5]
- 03 We made a first-in-class centralised switch in Europe for ellaOne®, making emergency contraception easily available to millions of people.
- **04** We were the first to switch and launch daily oral birth control to OTC access in the UK with Hana®.
- O5 In June 2022, we submitted an application for Opill to be the first-ever OTC oral contraceptive in the US. Opill is currently still pending FDA approval, but marks a groundbreaking moment in our journey to reducing barriers in contraceptive access.

We are actively prioritizing and listening to women and people to fulfil their potential, so that their sexual health is never a barrier for them.

The right of women and people

We are inclusive in our mission. Anyone with a femaleassigned reproductive system deserves this promise. And this includes partners and family of those making these decisions.

To determine their own

We aim to meet people's desire for personalized self-care. We make this available through wide access. And we aim to build long-term trust.

Sexual health journey

This is a lifelong journey, from menstruation to menopause and beyond. We are here for all of it, because sexual health influences every aspect of her life.

Access the solutions they want

We aim to offer widespread access to quality self-care interventions. We won't tell them what we think they need, but will listen to them to understand the solutions they want, and to make those available.

We are here to champion the right of all women and people to determine their own sexual health journey and access the solutions they want.

We have uncovered three key themes raised by women and people when it comes to their sexual health and wellbeing. Based on what we've heard from them, we've outlined how we aim to address these as our North Star to strive for.







Control, Safety, Authenticity

CONTROL:

We aim to help women and people embrace the uniqueness of their body and their life. By helping them understand their body and hormones, we work with their cycle, not against it, and support them to make intentional choices.

SAFETY:

Our primary goal is to provide safe contraceptive choices. In doing so, we protect them mentally and physically, because sexual health doesn't exist in a vacuum. We aim to make safe spaces for people to ask questions to empower individuals and communities.

AUTHENTICITY:

People deserve the facts. So we engage in factual, honest conversations directly with them. We equip and empower women to make the best choices for themselves, always on their own terms, and no one else's. Ultimately, when they have knowledge and control, they are empowered with the self-belief to know what they need.

Nearly half of all women report negative interactions with their health care providers, particularly low income and uninsured people. Negative interactions lead to poor health outcomes, distrust of the healthcare system, and health inequalities. [6]

Based on what we've heard from the women and people that we aim to serve, we have identified new commitments that will guide our future plans.



- O1 We will understand and focus on the needs of women and people, so that we can empower them on their sexual health journey.
- We will continue expanding OTC contraceptive access by bringing quality, affordable, prescription free products that consumers trust.
- 03 We will aim to ensure access is improved for women and people from neglected and underserved communities.
- **04** We will continue listening to the people we serve through ongoing research.
- 05 We will provide her clear and factual information to unlock personalized, holistic self care.
- We will champion them as they progress through life. As their needs change, and she's ready to make different decisions, we will be there. From getting to know contraception options and her fertility, to menstruation management, to perimenopause and beyond.
